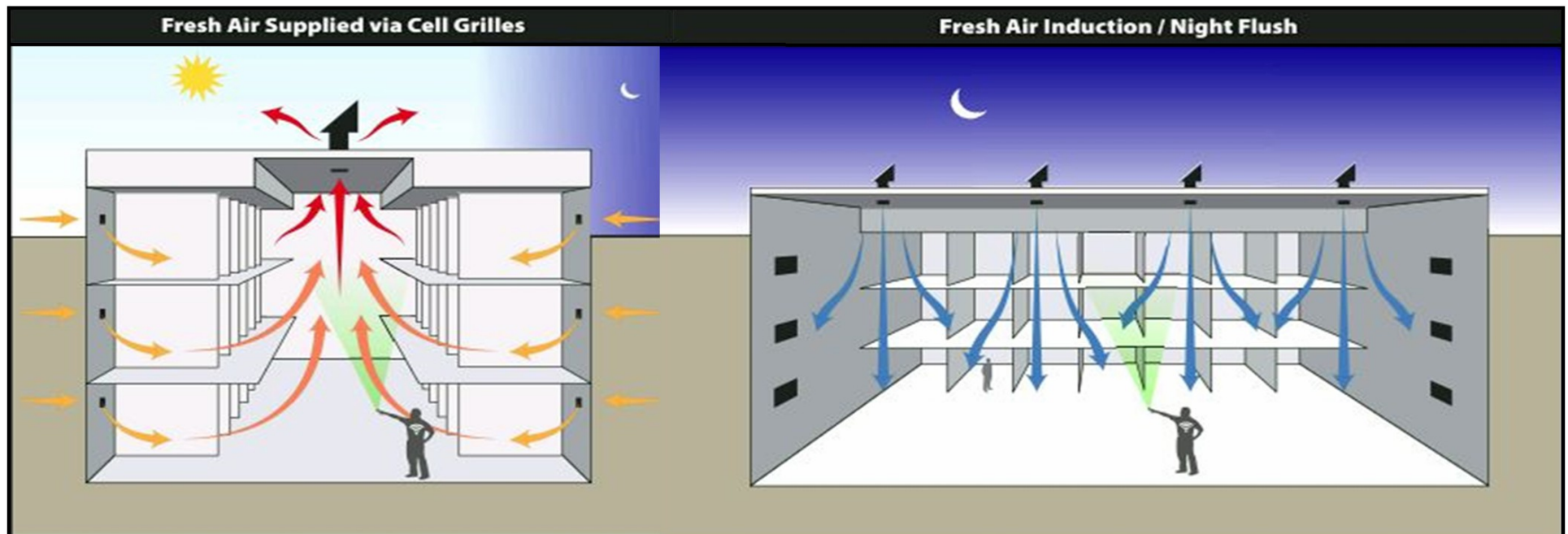
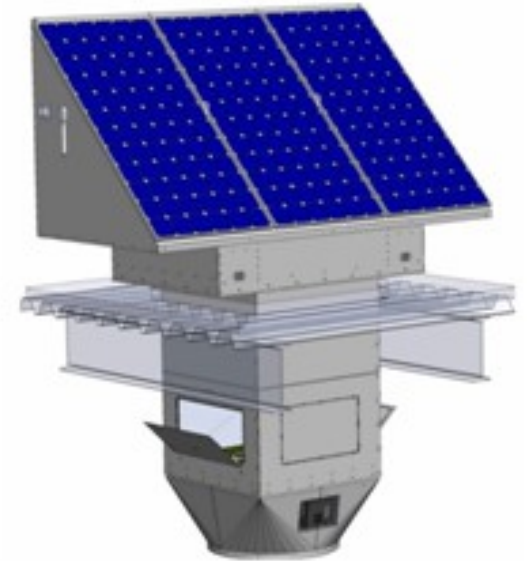

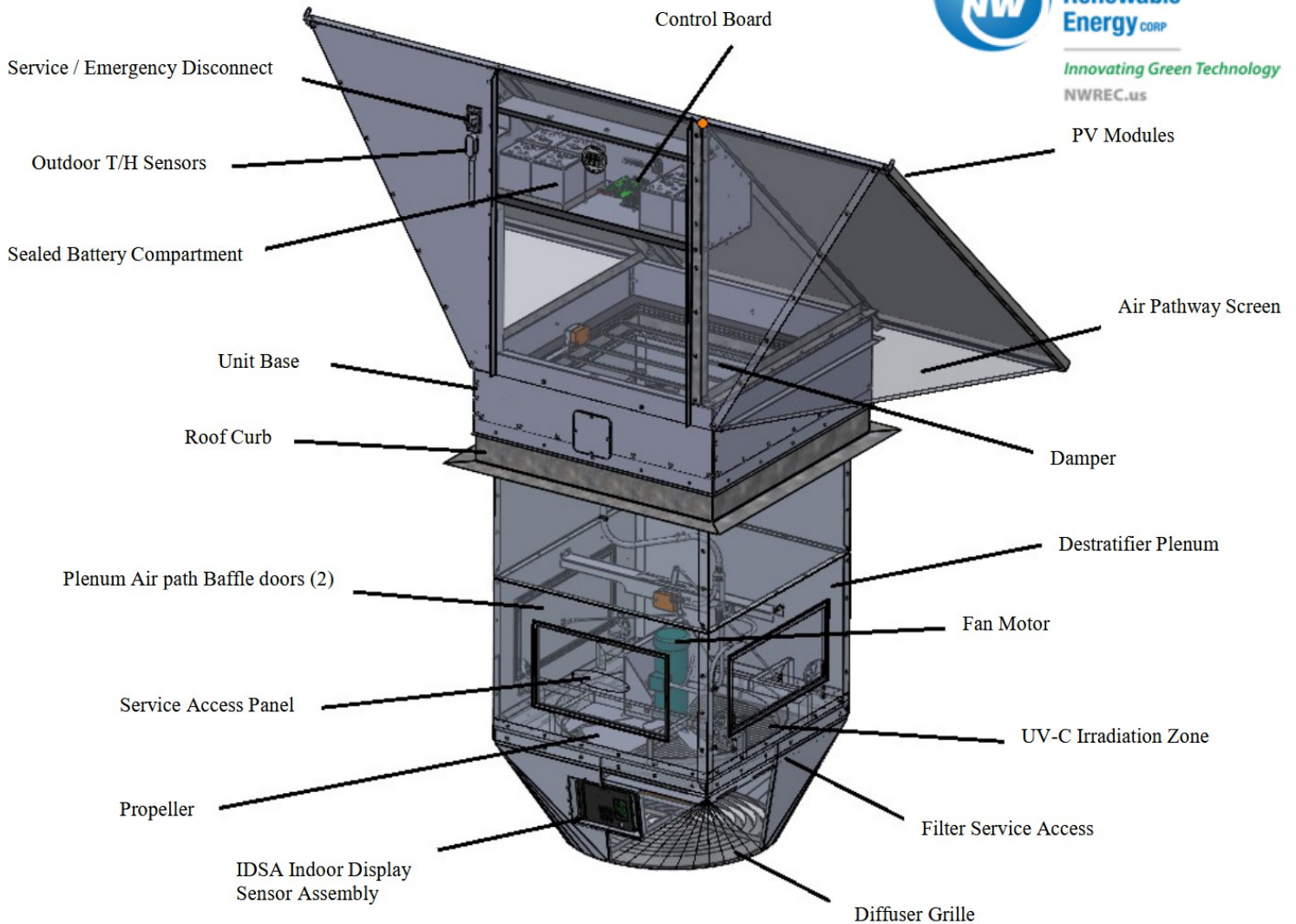

Optional Components:

The technical callout shows all optional components. For example the air filter and UV-C irradiation items would be for school and hospital applications. The Destratifier Plenum is commonly included but still optional. It can be omitted if a client simply needs induction and exhaust without destratification functions; which in this case, the motor & prop would be moved above the Roof Curb. The design is subject to change per application.

Field Use:

These SunCoolers to the right are on a client's high bay distribution center providing destratification during the winter months and heat exhaust, and nightflush cooling, in the summer months for much needed ventilation. SunCoolers have been installed on many structures such as correctional facilities, military training centers and MRE (meals ready to eat) storage facilities, and high bay warehouses.
